Passengers not following instructions and behaving foolishly	Passengers should be controlled by group leader/teacher who will be advised of safety instructions by skipper prior to departure	5	1	Low	All
Man overboard	Passengers wear lifejackets and understand safety procedures and stay under proper control	4	3	Medium	All

IMPORTANT — The Risk Assessment should only be approved once all significant hazards have been identified, the control measures are agreed and implemented, and the overall risk ratings are considered acceptable.
